- Summary of proposal.

Proposals will be reviewed by the Program Planning Committee, which is composed of national and local AJL members. Notification will be made in January 2013.

The program was the first under the new chapter presidents. Galina sent a note to Toby following the program in which she confessed that she and Marina were a little nervous about their first program; "however, our colleagues, Chapter members, were very supportive and helpful and the program went very nicely. Galina quoted Naomi Morse's remarks about Ann Brener, "I enjoyed meeting her and hearing her stimulating & knowledgeable presentation." Galina concurred that "the presentation about Judah Halevi was lovely and entertaining. Ann read some poems and emphasized very interesting play of words in the lines. All audience questions were answered afterwards. Even a reader/customer (?) of "Barnes & Nobel" was curious about our discussion and briefly shared his knowledge about Spain of the poet's time."

JUDAICA LIBRARY NETWORK OF METROPOLITAN CHICAGO

Our November 13 meeting took place at the Northwestern University Library. There was a demonstration of the online resource *The Visual History Archive*, published by the USC Shoah Foundation Institute for Visual History and Education. *The Visual History Archive* is a collection of videotaped interviews of testimonies of survivors and other witnesses of the Holocaust. The project was started by Stephen Spielberg in 1994. It has grown to be the world's largest collection of survivor testimonies, with 52,000 survivor interviews from 56 countries in 32 languages and is available through the Northwestern University Libraries website*. The Northwestern library is the only location in Illinois that has access to the entire archive. Librarians Harriet Lightman, Shoshanah Seidman, and Geoff Morse will lead the tour and demonstration.

On February 3, 2013 we will meet at Bernard Zell Anshe Emet Day School where our guest will be Susan Meyer, author of *Black Radishes* (a Sydney Taylor Honor Book). After the presentation we will discuss new children's books.

LONG ISLAND CHAPTER (LI-AJL)

LIAJL has held three wonderful programs this fall.

Our opening program featured a delightful talk by well-known author David A. Adler. He told us how he began his career as a writer and how his *Cam Jansen* series got its start. He explained his relationships with publishing houses, illustrators, and marketing people. David is now working on a biography series for young readers.

Our October program was held in concert with the Holocaust Memorial and Tolerance Center of Nassau County. Our speaker was the distinguished scholar Dr. Fariboz Moktari, author of *In the Lion's Shadow: The Iranian Schindler and his Homeland in the Second World War*. Dr. Moktari topic was "Abdol Hossein Sadari, The Iranian Schindler, Diplomat and Rescuer of Jews during the Holocaust."

Librarians and educators attended a panel discussion on Jonathan Sarna's book, *When General Grant Expelled the Jews*, on November 1. This is the the sesquicentennial year of the American Civil War (150 years). Brad Silverman, Reference Librarian, Sachem Public Library reviewed the book and Rabbi Gerard Solomon, Flushing Meadows Jewish Center, spoke about the Jewish community at the time of the Civil War. Rabbi Solomon has done extensive research on this topic.

Library Accreditation

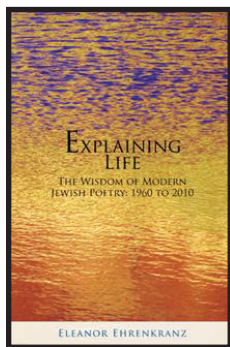
Attention School, Synagogue and Center Libraries:
